Since Roman times apples have been developed and many amateurs have raised our most popular varieties including Richard Cox, who developed one of the most famous apples in the 1820s, the Cox's Orange Pippin.

There are many clubs and societies helping to promote and preserve our diverse local apples, and if you have a tree in your garden and don't know what it is some organisations can help you identify it including Brogdale who identified the large apple tree near the Leisure centre as a Crimson Bramley.
